

Lithuania: Local Green **Future Days events**






Throughout the IGFD events in Lithuania, attendees had the chance to engage in interactive case study workshops. Here, they analyzed narratives gathered by Steering Group members and later took part in intergenerational panel discussions. initiatives to involve diverse generations in constructive Green Deal discussions have proven fruitful, as evidenced by positive feedback and significant event attendance, underscoring its societal importance. Furthermore, youth activism and their expressed commitment to seeking sustainable solutions emphasize genuine interest in planetary preservation. The event's format effectiveness is evident through active participation, allowing all attendees to contribute, ultimately leading to successful outcomes.

Following the organization of IGFD events in Latvia, several positive outcomes were observed: Networking opportunities provided for local and international students in environment-related topics, sparking interest in collaborating on the EU level. Older generations from diverse backgrounds served as inspirational role models for younger generations. Good practices showcased during the events served as strong incentives for peers to take action. Furthermore, participants expressed enjoyment in hearing stories and examples from different countries, including those from the African continent, appreciated the printed materials provided by various partner countries.

All **IGFD events in Sweden** were well-coordinated, ensuring participants' inclusion in discussions and providing them with new insights into environmental initiatives at governmental, local, and personal levels, with particular emphasis on contributions from Sweden, Latvia, and Lithuania. Surveys indicated high ratings for organizational and informational efforts.

Based on the organization of the events, several conclusions were drawn: Firstly, immigrants showed a lower understanding of the foundations of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the European Green Deal. Secondly, youth receive current information about environmental issues through school education. Thirdly, teachers and educators are mandated to incorporate SDGs and European Green Deal elements into their curriculum, supported by freely available educational materials from Educational Authorities. Fourthly, older generations tend to adopt environmentally friendly strategies in their daily lives without necessarily being aware of specific policies like the Green Deal. Fifthly, in Sweden, state policies regarding environmental protection are generally followed by authorities, businesses, and individuals. Sixthly, there is a notably positive attitude towards the utilization and implementation of circular economy principles. Lastly, there is a consensus that more participation leads to better outcomes in green projects.
